First, a Spark.....

On September 16, 1911, in the parlor of Tom Holland's Photographic Studio, Troop 1 of Beaumont, Texas was formed. Tom Holland was the Scoutmaster. One of the young scouts in Troop 1 was J. Rucker Newberry, who would go on to a very distinguished career as a professional scout. It began in 1922 as Scout Executive of the Beaumont Council.

With the Scout movement going strong in Southeast Texas in the Beaumont and Sabine Area Councils in the mid 20's, a new Scout Executive arrived in Beaumont from Chicago. Walter H. Gunn brought the Order of the Arrow with him. He was called out in 1921 by Carrol A. Edson, co-founder of the Order of the Arrow.

In a very short order, the Grand Lodge granted a charter for the Mitigwa Lodge #36 on May 25, 1928. Ray Asbury, David Abelman, and Curtis Cook were believed to be the first three Mitigwa Lodge members.

Camp Mitigwa had been in operation since the early 20's, with the Mitigwa Lodge in place to provide a good balance to summer camp that recognizes honor campers at the end of each session.

While details are not known about the early years of the OA in Southeast Texas, the 1930's were good years for scouting. The Sabine Area Council applied for and received a charter for Sioux Lodge #62 on June 13, 1932.

As time goes along in the 30's, scouting grows after the country begins to recover from the Depression. The number of scouts in the OA slowly grows with each year of summer camp in 1938. A parcel of land is named for the father of a wealthy timber and oil philanthropist, Camp Bill Stark comes into being.

In 1940, Walter Gunn and a small contingent of scouts attend the National Lodge meeting held at Camp Twin Echo in Ligonier, PA. The next year the Beaumont Council changes its name to Trinity-Neches Council to better reflect the area of the council.

As World War II was winding down, Walter Gunn takes a position with the Sam Houston Area Council in 1945. This brought a close to an 18 year tenure as Scout Executive and lodge staff adviser that showed growth for the OA in Southeast Texas.

After WWII, scouting grows along with the OA program. In 1948, land was purchased south of Woodville, Texas which becomes Camp Urland. By 1949, the Order of the Arrow was working feverishly to develop the new property.

In 1950, the Mitigwa Lodge send a petition to National requesting a name change. It was granted on March 7, 1950. The Neche Lodge #36 becomes the newest old lodge in the country. Later that year, Harry Massingill, Jr. and Ellsworth Sperling, Jr. accompanied by Lodge Adviser, A.C. Love, better known as "Unk" attended the 1950 National Conference in Bloomington, Indiana.

The 50's brought about the newsletter that's published by Neche Lodge known as the Pow-Wow. It contained various articles detailing events and upcoming events.

The Fiftieth Anniversary of scouting in 1960 marks the beginning of a decade that would end in major changes for the OA in Southeast Texas. Region Nine composed of Texas, New Mexico, and Oklahoma with a small portion of Arizona had divided into different 'areas'. Southeast Texas was located in Area 9B. There had been conferences held at various camps since the first one held at Camp Tom Wooten in 1941, hosted by Tonkawa Lodge.

Area 9B at the time was a lot of councils and Southeast Texas was on the fringe much like today. Beginning in 1955 this Area was divided and Area 9B was made into six lodges: Colonneh, Wihinipa Hinsä, Huaco, Sioux, Tejas, and Neche. The new and smaller Area 9B began a rotation on an annual basis where each year the conference would be held at the host lodge camp. In 1961, the host was Sioux Lodge held at Camp Bill Stark. Don Grimes was the Area Chief from Neche. The theme was 'Weld Tightly Ever Link'. The 1964 conference was held at Camp Strake with Ray Mathis from Sioux Lodge serving as Area Chief.

The Fiftieth Anniversary of the Order of the Arrow was celebrated in 1965 at the University of Indiana in Bloomington, Indiana. The Area 9B conference was held at Camp Urland, hosted by Neche Lodge. Jerold Byron of Neche served as secretary.

The 1966 conference held at Camp Pirtle was hosted by Tejas Lodge with Don Landry serving as Vice Chief of the Sioux. In 1967, James Clayton of Sioux served as Chief at Camp Karankawa, hosted by Wihinipa Hinsä.

A new era begins in 1969 when the conference is taken to a colleg campus. Ken Hayman of Neche Lodge would serve as secretary.

Then a Flame...

In 1970, the national office would bring about a merger of the Trinity-Neches Council and the Sabine Area Council on March 1, 1970. As a result of this merger, the two lodges would also merge to form a new lodge. Mr. Arden Cambre, Chairman of the Camping and Activities Committee would appoint a study committee to work on the formation of a new lodge. This committee included: Richard Eveland, Mark Merrill, Mr. John Brechin, Kent Hannegan, Charles Temple, Mr. Tony Booth, Mike Linden, Mr. Buddy Morrison, Mr. Bill McLaughlin, Frank Galloway, Mr. Tom Culp, and Mr. Denver Knowles.

After much research and study the following recommendations were proposed:

Lodge Name: Hasinai Lodge #578

The Hasinai Tribe is a part of the Caddo Nation. Early Spanish explorers called the Hasinai-Tejas meaning 'friend.' Tejas became the name of Texas.

Lodge Totem: Wood Duck

A species of duck native to this area and is one of the most colorful North American waterfowl.

A slate of officers was developed and presented at a meeting of all lodge members on May 23, 1970. The Hasinai lodge name, wood duck totem, and the first lodge officers passed unanimously. Hasinai Lodge and Three Rivers Council had the same #578 being the first council/lodge to have the same number in the BSA.

Now that the lodge members had approved a lodge name, totem, patch, by-laws and officers; it was time to get down to the business of running the lodge. With two camps holding summer camp, this meant that they would continue to perform their own callout ceremony. The lodge chief would not necessarily play Allowat Sakina, instead a camp chief would play the part.

Hasinai also was the host lodge of the Area 9B Conference, being held at Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas. Our special guest was founder, E. Urner Goodman. Ken Hayman would serve as 2nd Vice Chief. With the year half over only 2 or 3 events would remain for the first year.

Nineteen seventy-one would be the first full year for Hasinai. Lee Hickman would serve as Chief, Ken Hayman would be the Area 9B Chief and a contingent of youth and adults would attend the 1971 National Conference held at the University of Illinois.

As with any new lodge growing pains were experienced. Changes to the by-laws occurred at the annual business meeting also presented was a new lodge patch, neckerchief and, back patch designs. Some designs were good ideas, some were not. The lodge newsletter *Arrowpoints* had made its appearance early and was published at least quarterly. Keith Casey would serve as the 1972 lodge chief with Lee Hickman serving as 2nd vice chief of the Area 9B Conference.

1973 Changes and First:

National would reorganize the regions that had been in place since 1920, instead of being in Region 9 we would now be in the South Central Region, and our local conferences would be called 'conclaves.' Lee Hickman would be the first SC3A conclave chief. A contingent from the lodge would travel to the National Conference held at the University of California at Santa Barbara, California. The cost was \$44.00. The campus bordered the Pacific Ocean; you couldn't go any further West.

At the conference, Ken Hayman would be awarded the Distinguished Service Award, the highest award given by the Order of the Arrow. Usually given for service at the National and Region level, Ken would be the first individual from this area.

What does it Cost:

The lodge dues for most of the 1970's would be \$1.00 per year. A lodge event would cost \$4.50. The annual lodge banquet held in January would cost \$3.50 and the conclave in 1972 cost \$15.00 (two nights in a dorm room, 4 meals, a patch and program). With a minimum of participation you could earn a ceramic coffee mug which was a big hit with the adults.

Mid 1970's

The council is still operating summer camp at both Camp Urland and Camp Bill Stark for six weeks during the summer. Lee Sheek would be chief in 1974 and Steve Scott would be the lodge chief in 1975. Steve Scott led a contingent to the '75 National Conference held at the University of Miami in Oxford, Ohio. The next year Steve Scott would be the SC3A Conclave Chief at Baylor University. As the lodge moved toward the end of the '70's, Rick Greig would become the first two-time lodge chief serving 1977 & 1978, of Hasinai Lodge's young history. Rick would take a contingent to the '77 National Conference held at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. Rick would serve as the SC3A secretary at the 1978 conclave held at Sam Houston State University, Huntsville, Texas. Lyndon Hargraves would serve as the lodge chief 1979 & 1980. For the last NOAC of the '70's, we would head back west to Colorado State University, Fort Collins, Colorado.

1980's

This decade would open on a somber note, Dr. E. Urner Goodman, founder of the Order of the Arrow in 1915 passed away on March 13, 1980, while visiting family in New York. He was 88.

Lyndon Hargraves would complete his second year as lodge chief. Both camps are still holding summer camp, only now the number of weeks has been reduced. One camp opens first, then it closes and the same staff goes to the other camp for the duration of summer camp.

Hasinai Lodge would host the 1980 SC3A Conclave at Lamar University, Beaumont, Texas. Lyndon served as Section Vice Chief.

Annual dues would go up to \$1.25, the Fall Fellowship would cost \$8.50, and the conclave cost \$27.00. Frank McNamara would be the third straight lodge chief to serve as chief for two years 1981-82. The 1981 National Conference would be held at the University of Texas, Austin, Texas. It would never be any closer. For a second time, a Hasinai Lodge member would be awarded the Distinguished Service Award in 1981. Dale Beaty received this award for his long record of work at the National, region (NLS), and section conclaves. 1981 would be the last year the lodge would have its annual lodge banquet as a separate event held in January. Beginning at the Fall Fellowship '81 the banquet would be held on Saturday night. "Making Tracks with the Order", the 1982 Fall Fellowship theme featured steak with all the trimmings.

The summer camp program at Camp Urland and Camp Bill Stark had dwindled to three weeks at each camp. Due to a South Central Region realignment, Hasinai Lodge was now in SC5. The 1983 SC5 Conclave would be held at Texas Lutheran in Seguin, Texas. The National Conference was held at Rutgers University in New Jersey. Mark Anderson, lodge staff adviser, would be recognized with the Distinguished Service Award for his work at all levels of the Order of the Arrow. Currently he is the Program Director at Philmont Scout Ranch. Steven Pitts would serve as lodge chief and youth contingent leader.

Jay Cleaver would be elected as lodge chief for 1984 and was the section SC5 vice chief. The new lodge back patch would go on sale for \$10.00. The Fall Fellowship would have an event patch for the first time. It would have a Leni Lenape word on it " 'Majauchsuwi' meaning of one mind, united." Hasinai would close out the year with 428 lodge members with 98 of those being new ordeal members.

Mid 1980's

In 1985, the Tejas Chapter (Neches Valley District) and the Kuwe Chapter (Piney Woods District) are combined to form the Spindletop District. Summer camp is still three weeks at each camp. Lodge dues are now \$3.00. The SC5 Conclave was held again at Texas Lutheran in Seguin, Texas on August 2-4. Jay Cleaver served as the section chief.

The National Conference was pushed back one year to 1986, instead a Philmont Trek was held allowing representatives of each lodge to attend. Jay Cleaver would serve on the Special Events staff as vice chief.

A Passing of Tradition

At long last summer camp would not be held at Camp Bill Stark. The summer camp season of five weeks would be held at Camp Urland. Kemp Muhlbauer, the 1986 lodge chief was busy planning lodge calendars. The SC5 Conclave cost \$39.00 and the National Conference was held at Central Michigan University in Mt. Pleasant, Michigan. The cost was \$175.00

On October 25, 1986, Co-founder, Carroll A. Edson passed away. He was the last of those who were there in the 1915 beginning.

Rodney Harrison 1987 lodge chief would lead an enthusiastic group of officers. A history of lodge flaps, patches and neckerchief has begun to take shape. The SC5 Conclave would be a well-attended event with 97 lodge members attending.

1988 Cheerful Service

Bryan Girouard is the lodge chief for 1988. Bryan along with several other lodge members would attend a National Leadership Seminar at Ft. Polk, Louisiana. (Bryan Girouard, Jim Jeffery, Rodger Duke, Richard James, Andrew Milgram, Anthony James) BSA adults who attended included Lodge Adviser, Floyd Broussard and Associate Adviser, Robert Hobbs. Once again the South Central Region would shuffle the sections; beginning in 1988 we would become a part of the SC1 section. The conclave would be held at Lamar University Beaumont, Texas. We served as the host lodge. The cost was \$39.00. The National Conference would be held at Colorado State University in Ft. Collins, Colorado. The cost was \$195.00. Jay Cleaver would receive the Distinguished Service Award for his outstanding work as Section Chief, NLS staff, and special events staff for three NOACs and Vice Chief of Special Events at the 1985 O.A. Philmont Trek.

Hasinai Lodge would call out 127 candidates at summer camp, 78 would attend the Ordeal held July 22-23 at Camp Urland. The cost to attend: Arrowman \$7.00; Candidates/Brotherhood \$13.00. Hasinai Lodge would earn National Honor Lodge status being one of four lodges to receive this honor in the South Central Region.

The Arrowpoints to the Future

The goal for 1989 would be to earn the National Honor Lodge status for a second year. Lodge Chief, Jim Jeffery would lead the lodge beginning with officer training, January 20-21 at the BISD Outdoor Education Center in Lumberton, Texas. Annual dues would increase to \$5.00 and the new lodge neckerchief was \$15.00. The Fall Fellowship would be held at Camp Urland, December 15-17. The guest speaker would be Allen Mossman, the National Executive Secretary of the Order of the Arrow. Cost would be \$10.00. The theme was "The Arrowpoints to the Future." There was a Fall Fellowship patch. A 75th anniversary lodge pocket flap would be sold, the first lodge flap other than a current official lodge flap. Quantities were not restricted.

Seek the Knowledge – Share the Spirit

The celebration of the 75th year of the Order of the Arrow would begin with lodge officer training on January 12-13; followed by the Spring Fellowship May 18-19 at Camp Urland. Summer camp would be held for three week in June. At the two Ordeals that summer, Hasinai Lodge welcomed 112 new members.

The 1990 lodge chief Kevin Veal would lead the lodge contingent to the SC1 Conclave held at Lamar University July 27-29. Eighteen member of Hasinai Lodge would attend the National Conference at the University of Indiana in Bloomington, Indiana from August 13-17.

The Fall Fellowship would be held December 14-15 at Camp Urland. The cost was \$10.00. The banquet featured prime rib, baked potato, salad and cobbler. Over 100 attended the banquet.

The Order of the Arrow 75th anniversary award was earned by the following youths and adults:
Youth – Rory Burroughs, Garth Parker, Dee McWilliams, Bryan Girouard, Chris McKee, Kevin Veal;

1991

The newly minted lodge chief Keith Sander, would lead the lodge forward for '91. Lodge officer training was held on January 12, the Spring Fellowship was held at Camp Urland May 17-18, and the highlight of the event would be the presentation of the Founder's Award to Alan McKee and Keith Sanders. The two Ordeals held in July and August would see the induction of 132 new members. The SC1 Area Conclave would be held at Lamar University August 2-4. Cary Roberts, former National Vice Chief would close out the year by being the guest speaker at the Fall Fellowship held at Camp Urland on December 13-15. The Hasinai Lodge would again earn the National Honor Lodge status.

Rekindle the Flame

The year would start off with lodge officer training held at the Dishman Center on January 11th. Dee McWilliams, the 1992 lodge chief and his officers set the lodge goals. One of these goals was to implement a strong Elangomat System. The Spring Fellowship was held May 15-16 at Camp Urland. Seven new Arrowmen completed their ordeal and 23 members sealed their membership in our Order by completing their Brotherhood. The Founder's Award was presented to Raymond Howard, Sr. and Kyle Sanders. The Ordeals held in July and August would induct 134 new members into Hasinai Lodge. A new official lodge flap was rolled out at the Ordeals and a special NOAC flap was made available without restrictions. The SC1 Section Conclave was held at Sam Houston State, Huntsville, Texas on July 24-26. Seventeen lodge members attended the National Conference at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. The cost was \$185.00. The fifth and final recipient from Hasinai Lodge to receive the Distinguished Service Award would be Charles Beard for his many years of serving as section staff adviser, NLS staffing and administration level at past NOACs. (Thus far!)

The Fall Fellowship held December 18-20 would feature National Vice Chief Blair Dickins as the guest speaker. The lodge would earn the National Honor Lodge status for the third time.

Keep the Flame, Achieve the Purpose

Troop 67 of Port Neches, Texas would produce the 1993 lodge chief Aaron Kingston. National would once again consolidate the regions down to four from six. We would become a member of the Southern Region One (SR1). This was essentially the same area as the South –Central One. One of the first events in the SR1 was a training session held at Camp Avondale near Clinton, Louisiana on February 5-7. Thirteen lodge members attended. At the Spring Fellowship held May 15-16, twenty became Brotherhood members. John David Miller of Troop 267 of San Augustine was the lone ordeal member. The Founder's Award was presented to Aaron Kingston and Ben Akselsen at the banquet. The two summer ordeals would produce 118 new members. The SR1 Section Conclave would be held at Lamar University July 23-25. The cost was \$43.00. The Fall Fellowship theme was 'Keep the Flame, Achieve the Purpose.' Lodge and

chapter elections were held prior to the banquet on Saturday night. The lodge earned for the fourth time the National Honor Lodge status. The last three years being consecutive.

The Year of Service

Chris McKee was elected and served as lodge chief in 1994. The 1994 calendar would again start with lodge officer training held January 15th. In March, a work day occurred at both Camp Urland and Camp Bill Stark. The Spring Fellowship held at Camp Urland May 13-14 offered a make-up Ordeal, along with the Brotherhood test. The Founder's Award was presented to Frank Nixon and Garth Parker on Saturday night. The two Ordeals offered in July and August would yield 112 new lodge members.

Seventeen lodge members would attend the National Conference held at Purdue University, Lafayette, Indiana on July 31–August 4. Chris McKee would place 5th overall in the Vigil Ceremony as Allowat Sakima. The Fall Fellowship was held December 17-19. The lodge earned for the fifth time the National Quality Lodge status. (Previously known as National Honor Lodge.) The last four years being consecutive.

1970 – 1995 25 Years

Garth Parker would wear the Bonnet for the Silver Anniversary year of Hasinai Lodge. The lodge would offer a Spring break canoe trip. The Spring Fellowship was held May 5-6. The Founder's Award was presented to Chris McKee and Davis Short, Sr. Summer camp would be offered at Camp Urland for three weeks followed by two Ordeals: July 14-15; August 25-26.

Hasinai Lodge would offer a twenty-fifth lodge flap similar to the first lodge flap with a silver Mylar border. The Fall Fellowship would be held on December 15-17. The 1995 SR1 Section Conclave would be held at Sam Houston State, Huntsville, Texas. The cost was \$45.00.

1996 – 2000

The next five years of Hasinai Ledge would yield three lodge chiefs, Steven Pedigo 1996-97; Kyle Petkovsek 1998-99; Caleb Lopez 2000. Annual dues would increase to \$6.00. A new lodge flap would go on sale the summer of '98. A new neckerchief would be offered in '96 for \$20.00. The lodge would send a contingent to three NOACs: 1996 Indiana University, Bloomington; 14 members to Iowa State in 1998; University of Tennessee, Knoxville in 2000.

The first year for the O.A. troop representative was in 1999. The SR1 section conclaves would be held at Sam Houston State for 1996-1998; Stephen F. Austin University 1999-2000. The average cost was \$50.00. Garth Parker would serve as SR1 conclave vice chief in 1998.

2000 would be the last year for Ron Derry as staff adviser. He had served in this capacity for the past 13 years. The lodge will always be grateful for his dedication to the O.A. and the lodge.

2001-2005

The next five years would have no repeat lodge chiefs: Chad Srader 2001; Charles Leftwich 2002; Adam McKee 2003; Michael Moreau 2004; Robert Crane 2005. Annual dues increased to \$8.00. A special 35th anniversary patch would be produced in 2005. All wore the Bonnet proudly!

In 2001, Hasinai Lodge would participate in a Tri-Lodge Fellowship with Atchafalaya Lodge and Quelqueshoe Lodge to be held September 15-16 at a cost of \$15.00. August 2003 membership is shown at 490 members with 395 paid and 94 in arrears.

In 2001, a committee was formed and launched a fund raiser to generate funds for a lodge building. They sold a four piece ghost flap set for \$50.00. Two hundred sets were ordered. The Southern Region shuffled the deck again and we would find ourselves in SR2. The conclave would be held at Southwest Texas State in San Marcos in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2005. The lone year 2004 would see the conclave held at Bovay Scout Ranch near Navasota, Texas. Charles Leftwich would serve as conclave vice chief in 2001.

2006 – 2010

Three talented young men would serve as lodge chief for the next five years: Judson Lagrone 2006-07; Matt Romero 2008-09; Daniel Sharpless 2010. Annual dues would increase to \$10.00. A new lodge flap would be introduced in 2008. Lodge event patches would become standard for the Spring and Fall Fellowships. Two piece flap sets would come into fashion. A Vigil breakfast on Saturday morning of the Fall Fellowship would start in 2009. All proceeds from the patch sale went towards the building fund! A 40th anniversary two piece flap set was sold without restrictions.

The lodge would earn the National Quality Lodge status in 2008, 2009 and 2010.

The Prestigious E. Urner Goodman Camping Award would be earned in 2009. This is only awarded to two lodges per region each year. A good deal of time and effort went into the planning and submission of the petition.

After Hurricane Rita struck in September 2005, Camp Urland was devastated. Hundreds, if not thousands of trees came down and many buildings were damaged. Summer Camp for 2006 was cancelled and ten years later it still has not resumed.

SR2 section conclaves would be held at Lost Pines Scout Reservation 2006; Southwest Texas State 2007; Baylor University 2008. In 2009 we would lose our neighbors to the east and joined the new SR2-3S. The first conclave would be held at Bovay Scout Ranch 2009; Baylor University 2010.

Hasinai Lodge would win the Spirit Award for three consecutive years 2008 – 2010. This was quite an achievement when you consider several lodges have many more lodge members than us!

We would attend two NOACs in this time period, Michigan State University, East Lansing 2006; Indiana University, Bloomington 2009.

2011- 2015

The lodge would have four new lodge chiefs from 2011-2015, leading up to the centennial of the Order of the Arrow and Hasina's own 45th anniversary. They were Daniel Sharpless 2010-2011; Geoffrey Baker 2012; Brandon Cates 2013; Fred Pfister 2014; Jonathan Hill 2015. Annual dues remain at \$10.00. Several different two-piece flap sets would be made along with a special centennial flap and a 45th anniversary flap.

The lodge would continue to earn top honors for National Quality Lodge/Journey to Excellence Gold for 2011, '12, '13, and 2015. Receiving this award from 2008 – 2013 for six consecutive years is an impressive feat by the standard of any lodge.

A lodge callout that began in 2009 would continue to grow in popularity and attendance. Without a summer camp program, this offered a great opportunity for troops to have elected candidates 'called out' to become members of Hasina Lodge.

At the 2012, Fall Fellowship held at Camp Umland, National Committee member and the second recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award, Dabney Kennedy was the guest speaker. His inspirational speech that touched on over 65 years of scouting would serve as a testimony to the great benefits of service to all.

The section SR2-3S conclaves would be held at Texas A & M 2011-2012; Lost Pines Scout Reservation 2013; Texas State University 2014-2015. Two NOACs were held in this time period at Michigan State University, East Lansing 2012 & 2015.

The 2015 Centennial NOAC was the largest ever, 15,000 Arrowman attended. It was the hottest 'ticket' in town. Hasinai Lodge was allowed to send 15 youths and four adults.

The second century of the Order of the Arrow along with Hasinai Lodge demonstrates that the values and traditions first instilled on Treasure Island in 1915, still ring true today!

CENTURION AWARD

Michael W. Pitts comes from a family with deep roots in Scouting. Michael is the son of an Eagle Scout and received his Eagle Scout along with his two brothers. He served as a youth lodge officer and then as Associate Adviser beginning in 2002.

Beginning in 2008, Michael became the Hasinai Lodge adviser and began an extraordinary tenure through 2013. He completely rewrote all lodge procedures, increased lodge enrollment each year, along with the lodge obtaining either Quality Lodge or JTE Gold for six years straight under his leadership. The lodge made history by winning most of the awards at Conclaves over much larger lodges.

By his own admission, he feels that his greatest achievement was being able to develop a Callout weekend in 2008 because the Summer Camp season was interrupted by the devastation Camp Umland received by Hurricane Rita.

Michael has been a strong force in the advancement of Scouting in the Three-Rivers Council area.

Michael has certainly been an asset to Hasinai Lodge and deserves recognition for his countless hours in organization, communication, and dedication to Scouting.

Michael continues to serve scouting as the current Chairman of The Three Rivers Council Camping Committee and by providing assistance to the Lodge in various capacities.

Brandon Cates

CENTURION AWARD

Brandon has been a youth in Hasinai Lodge that exemplifies the term servant leadership to the fullest meaning of this term. From the time Brandon became an Order of the Arrow member, he has worked selflessly to implement the programs of the Lodge. He started as a Chapter Chief and with his hard work along with his Adviser took on reorganizing one of the biggest Chapters in our Council. They organized meetings and implemented the Lodge Program on a Chapter Level. He was instrumental in getting his Chapter having service days and staffing their District events.

From that experience as a Chapter Chief for two years he took on the job of leading Elections and Brotherhood Conversion for the whole Lodge. Through his leadership and implementation of a new program to track Elections he has able to increase the number of units that held Elections. He also updated the promotion of Brotherhood Conversion and was again successful and the Lodge was able to get to 30% Brotherhood Conversion for all the years he was over this program.

He then became the Lodge Chief of Hasinai Lodge. I think Brandon is one of the youngest Lodge Chiefs that the Lodge has ever had. He is a take charge kind of young man and immediately organized his Vice Chiefs and continued to be that example for all OA members of our Lodge.

He was able to work with all of our Chapters where we had officers in each of our four Chapters. His leadership was recognized by all adults that came in contact with him. It is amazing to watch a young man develop into a Servant Leader. He is soft spoken but his work ethic is very contagious to other young Arrowmen.

While serving in all these Leadership positions, he also served our Section for a number of years as a CVC. He is a Vigil Honor member, a Founders Award recipient and also has received our Lodge Arrowman of the year award. He also has served as Founder's Chairman and Vigil Committee Chairman. Brandon has earned his Eagle Scout status.

His servant leadership is not just limited to the OA. He has been a member of many Cub Scout staffs and has served on our Commissioner Staff at our Council Winter Camp.

Lee A. Hickman

CENTURION AWARD

Lee A. Hickman joined scouting as a cub scout. Lee was called out by the 1967 Neches #36 Lodge Chief, Mark Merrill in 1967. By 1968, Lee was working with ceremonial teams and was successful in starting the Atakapa Chapter in 1969 in his hometown of Silsbee, Texas. In his tenure as a youth in the lodge, he was instrumental in the writing of the lodge by-laws.

In the spring of 1970, the Trinity-Neches Council merged with the Sabine Area Council to form the Three Rivers Council. This merge began a New OA Lodge, Hasinai Lodge #578. He served as lodge editor in 1970. The first acting lodge chief was nominated by the merged members and approved in a quick meeting in 1971. Lee was the first elected lodge chief in a conventional lodge election. The merger was not well received by either side and there was much discontent all around. However, Lee was able to make a peaceful transition into a single lodge, which was not an easy task with two camps and much tradition on both sides.

Lee would go on to serve as Conclave 2nd Vice Chief in 1972 and Conclave Chief in 1973. Sadly, Lee was killed in an industrial accident at the age of 25. His legacy is still remembered for his dedication to Scouting and setting forth the foundation of Hasinai Lodge #578.

Walter Gunn
CENTURION AWARD

Walter H. Gunn was called out by Carroll A. Edson, Co-founder of the Order of the Arrow in 1921 at Camp Dan Beard in the Chicago, IL area. In 1926, Colonel Edson also called Walter Gunn for the Vigil Honor.

In 1927, Walter Gunn took the position of Scout Executive in Beaumont, Texas. Inspired by the positive approach of the Order of the Arrow to Scouting, Walter applied for a charter which was granted on May 25, 1928. The first three members are believed to be Ray Asbury, David Abelman, and Curtis Cook. The Mitigwa Lodge #36 came to be the Neche Lodge in 1950, then along with the Sioux Lodge #62 merged in 1970 to form the Hasinai Lodge #578.

Walter was very active in the OA in Southeast, Texas for the next 18 years. He was influential throughout the state of Texas in promoting the Order of the Arrow. He helped other councils develop a lodge, but he always called Southeast Texas his first love.

Walter attended the National Conference in 1940, but not much is known about his role at the conference. He did maintain a friendship with Carroll Edson for the rest of his life until his death on October 24, 1970.
